The Class of 1942 - Memories of Afton High School by Altha Spaulding Drake

Although I moved from New Jersey to Afton, NY half-way through my sophomore year, I lived on a farm across the Susquehanna until the Tabor's daughter went to college. The Tabors wanted a girl to help in the businesses for a few years. I stayed and my family moved back to New Jersey.

The Tabors had a complex on the corner; a dress shop, a diner, a funeral parlor, and a room to rent. I worked in the dress shop and the diner on Saturdays and I helped at funerals. The funeral home and dress shop were later owned by Tom Karshner. I also helped the principal's secretary as I was taking business courses.

I was a baton twirler with the band and a cheerleader. We could ride the bus with the team when they played away games. There was no movie theater in town.

The school had no screens on the windows. If you took your shoes off while studying your shoes might be thrown out the window. When the bell rang you had to hurry outside to get your shoes. There were nice tennis courts to play on, which I did often. I think that they might still be there. I remember Herkimer's grocery store, the soda shop, and the Afton Inn. There wasn't much else.

The school dances were great, as were the high school musicals. I was in the cast of HMS Pin-afore. School dances had good bands and were a favorite event. And, to think that AHS is still going strong in 2021 !

Did You Know:

- The first school in Afton was in a log cabin, in 1790, near the current intersection of East Main Street and Maple Avenue. The teacher was Nathaniel Church.

- By 1888, children went to school in over 15 district schools scattered around the Afton area; covering Afton, Coventry, Bainbridge, Colesville, Sanford, North Afton, Perch Pond, Vallonia Springs. The districts had to be small enough that students and teachers could walk.

- The districts acquired a name from a neighborhood, a prominent family or even a teacher. Examples are: Algerine Street, Guy District, and the Meek District.

- There were Select Schools, that supposedly were for the more well-to-do families. One such school is in a house located on the corner of Spring and Myrtle.

- In 1874, District 5, from the east side of the river, and District #12 on the west side combined to form the Afton Union School and Academy.

- The first School building was on the current property, known as the Afton Union School and Academy, was built in 1875. It was a two-story building. Two wings were added on in 1877 and in 1883. By 1881, there were 261 students in grades 1-12 enrolled. There were still 13 district schools covering the rural area.

- Children came on the train from neighboring communities to attend the Afton Union School and Academy. Tickets were bought in coupon booklets that lasted for several weeks.

- Young girl graduates, mainly, were hired as teachers in the early years. Teacher's Institutes were held for one to two weeks to give those wanting to teach an overview of the subjects from 1860-1880. Then the state began requiring those wishing to teach to take an examination. Later, the state required one year of study at a Normal School or Training School. Unadilla and Franklin were examples of Training Schools. Oneonta became a State Normal School in 1887.

- In 1908, a new \$25,000 brick structure replaced the 1875 wood frame building.

- Graduations and special programs were held in neighboring churches or in the upstairs of Sullivan's Hall (today's Afton Inn) to accommodate everyone.

- In 1929, an addition was built with classrooms, gymnasium and auditorium.

- Successive additions and remodeling have made room for the students and updated the facilities.

A Tribute To John Edward Lashway

John E. Lashway, of Afton, NY, passed away peacefully on Monday November 23, 2020, with his family by his side. He was born on October 28, 1936 in Oxford, NY a son of the late Earl and Mary Flora (Dominic) Lashway, Sr. John will especially be remembered as a loving husband and an excellent father to all. John was very proud to have served his country in the United States Air Force. He enjoyed a long career with P&G in engineering.

John was a graduate of Afton Central School, class of 1954. Later in life John became an avid golfer and was continually active in the Afton alumni golf tournaments raising money for the alumni association and always returning his team's winnings to benefit scholarships. When John became ill in early 2020, he decided to bequeath a large sum of money from his estate to the ACSAA to be used for scholarships. As treasurer of ACSAA, I received that check the day after John passed away. That money was immediately invested. The goal of the ACSAA is to eventually be able to fund the scholarships from the investments and to be able to increase the amount of the individual scholarships. We thank his wife, Ruth, and family members for their part in this bequest. John's bequest will continue to impact Afton graduates for years to come through the scholarships he helped to make possible.

A Tribute to Jane Moorhead Moran

Jane Moorhead Moran of Chenango Bridge passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by her family on August 6th, 2020. Jane graduated from Afton Central School in 1952. She was a mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. Jane was active in the Binghamton Gardening Club, the local Senior Club, former Treasurer of the Afton Alumni Association, and former owner of Special Lady, Campus Plaza.



When the Afton Central School Alumni Association reorganized in 2004, Jane was elected treasurer of ACSAA, a position that she held for several years. Her meticulous record keeping proved to be invaluable when the ACSAA filed for tax-exempt status in 2011. That tax-exempt status was granted. Jane wrote the very first scholarship check in 2005. After she handed over the treasurer duties to other members, she remained a strong and loyal supporter of the ACSAA. Many of her ideas were adopted by the current leadership. Jane's involvement in and loyalty to the organization will be missed.



Scholarship Additions

The ACSAA was approached by Laurie Briggs, class of 1978, concerning help with two scholarship efforts. The Bob & Ann Briggs scholarship has existed since 2013 and is administered by the Afton Central School District. The ACSAA agreed to be a conduit for the donations to that scholarship effort. We received \$5600 in donations for that scholarship and that amount was sent to the school district. The Briggs family scholarship for \$500 is awarded to a senior, male or female, who is furthering their education in a two or four-year college and who will also be involved in athletics.

The second scholarship, also championed by Laurie, will be given in memory of Karen Zablocki, class of 1978, who tragically died in a car-pedestrian accident. This scholarship will be given to a person who is pursuing higher education in forestry, conservation, or environmental science. Since these are specialized fields, we may not get an applicant every year.

The ACSAA regularly gives out five \$1000 scholarships each year. When we have an applicant in forestry, conservation, or environmental science, we will give it as a sixth scholarship in Karen's name for that year. The amount of the scholarship, unless amended, will be \$1000.



As the class of 1981 celebrates their 40-year reunion, in which Jim Wilcox was a member, his family would like to thank everyone who has supported us since we lost him. The two men who were responsible for his murder have recently died in prison. We are relieved from the burden of reliving the nightmare every two years with parole board hearings. Jim's family is blessed by everyone who signed petitions, wrote letters, gave words of encouragement and prayed for us during this time. We can never put into words how much that meant to us. We are thankful that Jim is remembered each year at graduation with a memorial scholarship for art. Moving forward we are just going to remember the happy times with Jim. Thank you!
